





A message from SVCT's President...

Welcome to *Newsies Jr. the Musical*, our 2021-2022 season teen musical! Newsies Jr. is loosely based on the events and participants of the newsboy strike of 1899 against newspaper publishers Joseph Pulitzer and William Randolph Hearst.

Newsies Jr. debuted at the Nederlander Theatre on Broadway on March 29, 2012. It was nominated for eight Tony Awards and won the awards for Best Choreography (Christopher Gatelli) and for Best Original Score (Alan Menken).

The fundamental conflict in the show is the exploitation of child labor. Pulitzer raised the price the Newsies had to pay for the paper, destroying their ability to make a living wage. The courage of the Newsies was the first blow to the greed that allowed the existence of child labor. The strike of 1899 was 123 years ago, but the fight for a living wage and human dignity in work goes on today.

For over fifty years SVCT has been the only all-volunteer, nonprofit theatre providing outstanding theatre experiences for the communities of South County. In 2019 we acquired Limelight Theater in Gilroy, just before the pandemic shut us all down. We are so excited to finally be able to offer productions from both of our locations.

As we all reclaim our lives in response to the COVID pandemic we find the challenges are many. Here at SVCT we are rebuilding our greatest resource: people! We invite you to become a volunteer (on the stage or backstage) for SVCT. Please see our web site for volunteer opportunities!

Tickets for the production of *Tigers be Still* are on sale! This is the final show of the Limelight 2021-22 season and is opening on May 6, 2022. Seating is limited and the shows sell out, so buy your tickets early!

We will close our 2021-22 Playhouse season with Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*, opening June 17th. It promises to be a spectacular production that will delight the ear and the eye from the prologue to the last note of the finale. Tickets are on sale now. We expect this production to sell out as well, so please buy your tickets early!


The Tradition of the Gypsy Robe


